**MINUTES**

Trustee Zuercher moved to approve the minutes for the regular meeting of October 5, 2020, and Scranton seconded.

Trustee Zuercher moved to approve all bills incurred since October 5, 2020, and Scranton seconded.

Trustee Scott reported that Police Chief Rob Siwak has conducted interviews, and the final two candidates for police officer will be screened by the Police Committee Tuesday evening.

Trustee Zuercher informed the Board that when *Wagenbach* completes the insulation work at the Community Center this week, work at this site will be complete.

Trustee Scranton moved to transfer \$757.44 from General Fund Savings to Police Operations Checking to cover bills. Zuercher seconded.

Trustee Getz updated the board on the Chestnut Street project saying that the curb and gutter work is about 75% complete, and that asphalt work should begin in November weather permitting.

Discussion concerning the hiring of a Public Works laborer indicates that the active search will begin in January with the hopes that the vacancy will be filled by March.

Work on the new trailer ordinance is ongoing and should be ready for presentation at the November 2 meeting. The issue at hand concerns needed definitions as well as a repeal provision.

Trustee Scranton reported that, after speaking with Police Chief Siwak, the current law regarding the parking of large commercial and recreational vehicles on Village streets is much too vague and should be addressed soon.

Finally, Attorney Dick Wherry informed the Board that the bond issue closes Thursday, and the Village should receive its money at that time.
