Paving the Way for Future Success - Transition Initiative

After graduating from Tremont High School, students are faced with a variety of challenges and opportunities. Some students will pursue full time employment while others will enroll in post-secondary institutions. Most of our graduating seniors do pursue an academic degree or complete a certificate program. One of our main objectives in our special education department at Tremont High School is to prepare students to transition to post-secondary institutions or the work place more effectively and efficiently.

Our department offers several opportunities/programs for students to participate in to assist them with their transitional goals. Under the Individualized Education Program (IEP), each student is given three transitional goals. As teachers, it is our responsibility to align our students career interests to their transitional goals. The three categories under these

transitional goals are employment, education, and daily living skills. These goals help the students to be better prepared for the work place or an academic setting.

Our department offers an annual trip to Illinois Central College for juniors. The students are given a guided tour of the campus, while experiencing a college atmosphere. Also, they are introduced to Teri Ingles (Access Services Coordinator) who assists students with a variety of special needs and helps implement accommodations when necessary. They also have the opportunity to seek academic advisement to assist them with registering or scheduling.

Tremont High School offers cooperative vocational education and work experience programs. Students are able to work during the school day and earn academic credits. The goal is to provide the opportunity for students to work while the cooperative teacher monitors their job proficiency. Our staff member introduces professional skills such as punctuality, team work, and conflict resolution. After completing these work based programs, students are better prepared vocationally. Furthermore, some students can receive services from Department of Rehabilitation Services or STEP after graduating from high school.

Students are given a variety of opportunities in several classes to work on their employment skills. They participate in mock job interviews, job shadowing experiences, and completing official resumes. Most of these activities are connected to their transitional objectives under their IEP.

As a staff, it gives us great pleasure seeing our student's succeed academically and vocationally after graduating from Tremont High School. By establishing good rapport and quality relationships with students, it helps us establish programs that are relevant to our student's needs.



Tremont Historical Society Meeting: Tremont Blacksmith Shop

The March Historical Society program will be a presentation on The Tremont Blacksmith Shop by Maurie Schaefer, the son of Ernest Schaefer, who operated the shop across from Tremont Grade School from 1950-1988. As a young boy, Maurice worked in the shop, and then attended United Electronics Institute in Louisville, Kentucky, graduating with an Electronic Tech Degree. He was employed for 40 years by Caterpillar, as an instrument repairman, technician, Senior Project Engineer and Engineering Supervisor. His learning experience at the blacksmith shop was very helpful in shaping his Caterpillar career. He is now retired and lives

in rural Tremont.
