Did you know...?

Have you ever thought about the names on some of Tremont's street signs?

Our main street is Sampson. William Sampson was one of a committee of three men from New York who chose the site of Tremont as a place to start a colony. They brought a group of people by wagons to settle in the future Tremont with them. Our town was laid out by Sampson and the other two men, John H. Harris, and Josiah L. James. Sampson Street borders the west side of the "town square," which we call the City Park. The square was laid out to be in the center of the business community. James Street cuts through the City Park and continues south, ending at the courthouse Square, where the Tazewell County Courthouse once stood. And Harris Street borders the city park to the east. So the center of the original business district is where the three men who founded Tremont are honored. Take some time to notice their namesake streets next time you are in the area, and thank the men who founded Tremont!
